### Averages on the American Registry of Radiologic Technologist (ARRT) credentialing examination

BENCHMARK: Pass rate of not less than 75% on first attempt within six months of graduation

### Program Completion Rate

Program completion rate is defined as the numbers of students who complete the program within the stated program length. The program length for the clinical & didactic phase of the program is 24 months, and program completion rate is defined as those students graduating within 36 months of beginning the didactic phase of the program

BENCHMARK : Job placement rate of not less than 75% within twelve months from the day of graduation

2014	96%	26 graduates seeking employment 25 employed within 1 yr.
2015	96%	25 graduates seeking employment 24 employed within 1 yr.
2016	97%	30 graduates seeking employment 29 employed within 1 yr.
2017	89%	28 graduates seeking employment 25 employed within 1 yr.
2018	96%	24 graduates seeking employment 23 employed within 1 yr.
2014-2018	5 yr. average=95%	133 graduates seeking employment 125 employed within 1 yr.

$$\text{Job Placement Rate} = \frac{\text{Number of graduates employed in the radiologic sciences}}{\text{Number of graduates actively seeking employment in the radiologic sciences}}$$

#### JRCERT has defined not actively seeking employment as:

- graduate fails to contact program officials regarding employment status after multiple attempts
- graduate is unwilling to seek employment that requires relocation
- graduate is unwilling to accept employment due to salary or hours
- graduate is on active military duty, and/or
- graduate is continuing their education
